A Message from Fr. Pedro

Dear Parishioners of St. Joseph's Church,

Lent will be with us earlier this year.

Catholics everywhere are talking about it. Lent this year begins on February 14. Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day are on the same day this year. Distribution of ashes in our parish will be during two Masses – at 9 a.m. and in Spanish at 6:30 p.m. – and at the church through the day for those who cannot come to Mass.

Mass is a beautiful and romantic thing: We show Jesus our love, and He does much more for us by giving Himself to us totally – Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity! The Eucharist is an unbelievably holy and intimate gift of love that we should not take for granted, and this is how we begin our Lent, which is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

"During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ." (USCCB)

This is an opportunity to give our love to Jesus and to anyone – an opportunity to love our parish and support it by almsgiving as well.

Please mark your calendars for all or any of the events coming up during this sacred time. The Lord invites us in Lent to spend time with Him. Tell Our Lord Jesus that you love Him and that you dedicate this Lent to learning how to love Him more. Visit Him where He quietly waits for you in the tabernacle at your parish or in any of the parish events during Lent.

Lenten Season Events

February 13: Burning of the Palms after Mass. Bring palms from last year to burn.

February 14: Ash Wednesday. Mass at 9 a.m. Father Pedro will bless the ashes; the church will be open through the day for prayers and ashes.

February 14: Ash Wednesday. Spanish Mass at 6:30 p.m.

February 16 and Every Friday of Lent (except 2/23): Anointing of the Sick after Mass. Offered after Mass every Friday during Lent except on Feb. 23.

February 16 and Every Friday of Lent: Stations of the Cross at 4:30 p.m.

February 16 and Every Friday of Lent: Soup Supper. Soup and bread will be served after Stations of the Cross.

February 18 and Every Sunday of Lent (except 2/25 and 3/24): Confession at 9 a.m. Father Pedro will hear confessions at 9 a.m. before Mass every Sunday during Lent except Feb. 25 and March 24.

February 20 and Every Tuesday of Lent: Morning Prayer and Mass. Morning Prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours will be combined with Mass every Tuesday of Lent.

March 10: Laetare Sunday. Father Pedro will perform the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick after 10 a.m. Mass.

March 23: Palm Sunday Vigil. Mass at 5 p.m. Mass begins outside with a procession into the church.

March 24: Palm Sunday. Mass at 10 a.m. Mass begins outside with a procession into the church.

March 28: Holy Thursday. Mass at 6:30 p.m. No morning Mass on March 28.

March 29: Good Friday. No Mass. 1 p.m. Divine Mercy Chaplet, Scriptural Rosary, and Music and Scripture. 3 p.m. Liturgy with Veneration of the Cross and Communion. 6 p.m. Stations of the Cross with no Soup Supper.

March 30: Easter Vigil. Mass at 7:30 p.m. Fire outside will start at 7 p.m.

March 31: Easter Sunday. Mass at 10 a.m.
